Jalen Hurts leads Alabama to Victory over Texas A&M

On a game watched on national TV, top ranked Alabama fought off their rival Texas A & M, and ended with a 33-14 victory to maintain their #1 position in college rankings.

Much of the credit went to Jalen Hurts, the QB who can run and throw with extraordinary skill. Hurts was also an outstanding quarterback when he played for the Channelview Falcons prior to leaving for Alabama.

Falling behind in the 3rd quarter 14-13, Hurts engineered a 14 play, 77 yard drive then ended in a short pass for a TD. Then

in the 4th quarter, he scrambled for 37 yards and scored another touchdown, giving the Crimson Tide a commanding lead that they carried to the end of the game.

North Shore smothers Channelview 68-0

The annual rivalry between the North Shore Mustangs and the Channelview Falcons ended last Friday night with an overwhelming tromping of the Falcons by the Mustangs.

North Shore now has a 7-1, District 5-0 record, while Channelview falls to 3-5, and 2-3.

The Mustangs used two quarterbacks, Bryant Badie and Isaac Cerda, who combined for 309 yards and three touchdowns. North Shore had a total of 545 yards gained on offense. Badie scored one of the TDs on a rush, and Kerrion Hadnot had

two rushing TDs for 102 yards. The defense for the Mustangs kept the Falcons down field, and they had to punt 9 times. North Shore had 21 first downs, compared with 9 for Channelview.

Voter identification requirement changed for upcoming presidential election

Jacinto City, Tx. October 14, 2016 - Senator Sylvia Garcia, hosted a Town Hall Meeting with Texas Secretary of State Carlos Cascos and representatives from the Harris County Clerk's Office to explain to Election Judges and Community Leaders the recent changes brought about by a Federal Appeals Court ruling that the Texas Voter ID law enacted in 2011, discriminated against minority voters.

Senator Garcia said, "Voting is one of the most important constitutional rights. We've got to take steps to make sure everyone has access to the ballot. It's good when officials in charge of elections visit with on-the-ground election workers and organizers so there's a clear understanding of the new rules for Voter Identification before Election Day."

On August 10, 2016 the United States District Court Southern District of Texas Corpus Christi Division ordered The State of Texas to implement the agreed terms for the November 8, 2016 election.

The Court Order allows

for voters whose name appear on the official list of registered voters and present documentation of an acceptable Photo Identification or presents a valid voters registration certificate, a certified birth certificate, a current utility bill, a bank statement, a government check, a paycheck, or any other government document that displays the voter's name and address and conveniently completes a reasonable Impediment Declaration form shall be permitted to vote using a regular ballot.

The reasonableness of a voter's impediment for not possessing a photo ID shall

not be questioned by election officials. Some examples of a voter's impediment for not possessing a photo ID at the time of voting could be lack of transportation, family responsibilities, disability, illness, misplacing it, work schedule or theft etc.

Voter's can vote if their name that's on their ID is a customary variation or similarity of the voter's formal name. For example, Bill for William, Robert or Bob or Beto for Alberto is acceptable.

Voter's identification's is acceptable if the voter's name contains an initial, middle name, or former

name that is either not on the official list of registered voters or on the voter's ID and or if a first name, middle name, former name or initial of the voter's name occupies a different field on the presented ID document than it does on the list of registered voters.

The Presidential General Election will take place on Tuesday, November 8, 2016. Early voting takes place from Oct. 24 - Nov. 4.

Last Wednesday two males rival for a Mac Nuggets waitress took their matter from the smoking overhead to the parking lot and upon arrival there one rival slashed the Wal-Mart employee in the chest with a knife. HALLOWEEN HINTS Thirteen Safety hacks to ease your fears

(NAPSI)—Halloween can be more fun and less frightening when you keep these 13 safety suggestions from security experts in mind:

- When out on Halloween night, avoid areas that are not well lit and try to walk in high-traffic areas.
- Keep your cell phone handy in case you get separated from your group or need to contact emergency services. If you go out alone, let a trusted friend or family member know where you are and whom you are with.
- Make use of safe forms of transportation such as cabs.
- If you're going to a party venue, familiarize yourself with the fire exits when you arrive so that you are prepared if an emergency evacuation occurs.
- Bear in mind that other people may not be knowledgeable about your costume and its accompanying props. Don't carry

fake weapons. You don't want to scare anyone around you or alarm the police.

- Don't eat or let kids eat any trick-or-treat loot you haven't opened yourself.
- When driving, watch for children in the street and on medians.
- Prepare your home for trick-or-treaters by clearing porches, lawns and sidewalks and programming your outdoor lighting to turn on early—or install "smart" lights that go on when they detect movement. Keeping your walkway well lit can prevent your neighbors and their kids from injuring themselves. Keep lit pumpkins and candles away from where children will be walking. A video doorbell can help you tell whether it's really trick-or-treaters on your porch or someone more sinister—and if someone eggs your door while you're out, you'll

know who did it.

- Give your kids a curfew.
- Trick-or-treaters should travel in groups and be accompanied by an adult with a cell phone. They should go to only well-lit houses, remain on porches rather than go into any house, and stay in familiar neighborhoods.
- Everyone should remember to walk, not run and obey all traffic rules and signals.
- Make sure costumes don't drag on the ground and masks don't obstruct vision.
- If you go out of town, lock up your valuables and store them in a safe place. When leaving the house, make sure you lock your doors and set your security alarm system. While ADT doesn't protect your home against the paranormal, it can keep out mortal intruders while you're enjoying Halloween festivities.

"Diamond Jim: What can you tell us about the US Coast Guard?"



ASK DIAMOND JIM

THE UNITED STATES COAST GUARD

The United States Coast Guard (USCG) is a branch of the United States Armed Forces and one of the country's seven uniformed services. The Coast Guard is a maritime, military, multi-mission service unique among the U.S. military branches for having a maritime law enforcement mission (with jurisdiction in both domestic and international waters) and a federal regulatory agency mission as part of its mission set. It operates under the U.S. Department of Homeland Security during peacetime, and can be transferred to the U.S. Department of the Navy by the U.S. President at any time, or by the U.S. Congress during times of war. This has happened twice, in 1917, during World War I, and in 1941, during World War II.

Created by Congress on 4 August 1790 at the request of Alexander Hamilton as the Revenue Marine, it is the oldest continuous seagoing service of the United States. As Secretary of the Treasury, Hamilton headed the Revenue Marine, whose original purpose was as the collector of customs duties in the nation's seaports. By the 1860s, the service was known as the U.S. Revenue Cutter Service and the term Revenue Marine gradually fell into disuse.

The modern Coast Guard was formed by a merger of the Revenue Cutter Service and the U.S. Life-Saving Service on 28 January 1915, under the U.S. Department of the Treasury. As one of the country's five armed services, the Coast Guard has been involved in every U.S. war from 1790 to the Iraq War and the War in Afghanistan. As of

2012 the Coast Guard had approximately 42,000 men and women on active duty, 7,900 reservists, 32,000 auxiliary personnel, and 8,700 full-time civilian employees. In terms of size, the U.S. Coast Guard by itself is the world's 12th largest naval force.

The Coast Guard's legal authority differs from the other four armed services, as it operates simultaneously under Title 10 of the U.S. Code and its other organic authorities, such as Titles 6, 14, 19, 33, and 46. Because of its legal authority, the Coast Guard can conduct military operations under the U.S. Department of Defense or directly for the President in accordance with Title 14 USC 1–3. The Coast Guard's enduring roles are maritime safety, security, and stewardship. To carry out those roles, it has 11 statutory missions as defined in 6 U.S.C. § 468, which include enforcing U.S. law in the world's largest exclusive economic zone of 3.4 million square miles (8,800,000 km2). The Coast Guard's motto is the Latin phrase, Semper Paratus (English: Always ready).

The Coast Guard has roles in maritime homeland security, maritime law enforcement (MLE), search and rescue (SAR), marine environmental protection (MEP), the maintenance of river, intracoastal and offshore aids to navigation (ATON).

With a decentralized organization and much responsibility placed on even the most junior personnel, the Coast Guard is frequently lauded for its quick responsiveness and adaptability in a broad range of

emergencies. In a 2005 article in Time magazine following Hurricane Katrina, the author wrote, "the Coast Guard's most valuable contribution to [a military effort when catastrophe hits] may be as a model of flexibility, and most of all, spirit." Wil Milam, a rescue swimmer from Alaska told the magazine, "In the Navy, it was all about the mission. Practicing for war, training for war. In the Coast Guard, it was, take care of our people and the mission will take care of itself."

Search and Rescue

While not the oldest, search and rescue (SAR) is one of the Coast Guard's best known missions. The National Search and Rescue Plan designates the Coast Guard as the federal agency responsible for maritime SAR operations, and the United States Air Force as the federal agency responsible for inland SAR. Both agencies maintain rescue coordination centers to coordinate this effort, and have responsibility for both military and civilian search and rescue. The two services jointly provide instructor staff for the National Search and Rescue School that trains SAR mission planners and coordinators. Previously located on Governors Island, New York, the school is now located at Coast Guard Training Center Yorktown at Yorktown, Virginia.

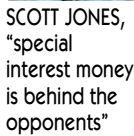
