Sheldon approves plans for New High School

The Sheldon ISD school board recently approved these plans for the new high school and site development fronting Beltway 8 near Garrett Road.

The project is part of the \$285 million bond issue passed by voters in May 2016, according to Superintendent King Davis.

General Contractor Durotech has begun work on the site, clearing and

on the site, clearing and grading in the initial phase.

a new football stadium, parking and a water retention lake.

Davis said that the bond package also included a new sixth elementary school, technology upgrades district-wide, and conversion of C.E. King high school to a new middle school, and conversion of the middle school to an Educational Support Building. Other additions and renovations will be undertaken on existing district schools.

morning. Rusell Cormier, 53, is charged with the Rusell Cormier, 53, is charged with the murder of his estranged wife, 61-year-old Fannie McWhite, at approximately 6 a.m. on Tuesday, April 17 in the 12300 block of Greencanyon Drive.

Cormier fled McWhite's residence in a black Toyota Tundra pickup and drove to a residence in the 600 block of Shotwell in northeast Houston.

There he collected some belongings and set the trailer in which he was living in on fire.

NORTH CHANNEL CHAMBER Rockets Mascot "Clutch" speaks about his career

Members of the North Channel Chamber were entertained by a speaker that they knew in costume, as "Clutch the Bear" the Houston Rockets mascot, but didn't know as a person. Robert Boudwin spoke about his personal live, including the 21 years he enjoyed and profited from being mascot Clutch, and the "craziest half hour of my life" with several personal tragedies in 2011. Boudwin showed a video of his stunts and performances as Clutch. He said he talked his way into the job, starting at \$20,000 a year and ending at \$300,000 a year. His tragedies included a father with cystos fibrosis that needed a lung transplan, a wife that left him at his time of crisis, and the sale of his house in the midst of this. Boudwin has

at his time of crisis, and the sale of his house in the midst of this. Boudwin has become an advocate for organ transplants, and urged the audience to register for this cause. 

Federal judge says again, Texas voter ID law is discriminatory

AUSTIN — U.S. District Judge Nelva Gonzales Ramos of Corpus Christi on April 10 ruled the State of Texas has failed to prove that the voter identification law was not written with discriminatory intent and purpose.

with discriminatory intent and purpose.

The ruling came in response to a charge by the New Orleans-based U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit that Judge Ramos re-examine the evidence and her 2015 find-base in New Propose to be ings in Veasey et al., plaintiffs, v. Greg Abbott et al., defendants. Plaintiffs alleged racial

Plaintiffs alleged racial discrimination in violation of the U.S. Voting Rights Act of 1966 in response to the passage of Senate Bill 14 by the Texas Legislature in 2011. The law changed the list of acceptable forms of identification voters may use at polls and enacted other restrictions. The State of Texas argued that the law was passed not with a discriminatory purpose, but to combat voter fraud at the polls.

Ramos wrote that law-yers for the State of Texas failed to demonstrate that the law would have been enacted without a discriminatory purpose. Ramos said SB 14 violates Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, a provision that generally prohibits the enforcement of discriminatory voting laws.

Ramos, under a direc-

tive issued by the Fifth Circuit last summer, prescribed an interim voting plan for Texas to over

ing plan for Texas to overcome discriminatory effects in the voter ID law in time for the November 2016 general election. It is up to the Texas Legislature to craft a state law that does not violate the federal voting rights law.

Meanwhile, legislation filed in the current session of the Texas Legislature by Sen. Joan Huffman, R-Houston, addresses federal court issues with the voter ID law. Huffman's SB 5 was passed on March 28 by the Republican-domi-





nated Senate on a 21-10, party-line vote and now awaits a hearing by the House Elections Commit-

Hegar distributes revenue Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar on April 12 announced his office would send cities, counties, tran-sit systems and special purpose taxing districts \$620.2 million in local sales tax allocations for

sales tax allocations for April.

The amount is 4.9 percent more than in April 2016. These allocations are based on sales made in February by businesses that report tax monthly.

"The cities of Houston, San Antonio, Dallas and Austin saw noticeable increases in sales tax allocations," Hegar said. "The cities of Sugar Land, McAllen, Irving and Grand Prairie saw noticeable decreases."

In other news, on April 10, Hegar promoted the upcoming "sales tax holiday" on emergency preparation supplies

ration supplies.
From April 22 to April 24, Texans may purchase tax free items such as batteries, fuel containers and

flashlights priced at less than \$75; hurricane shut-ters and emergency lad-ders priced at less than \$300; and portable gener-ators priced at less than \$3,000.

Seat belt bill advances The Senate Transporta-

advances
The Senate Transportation Committee voted unanimously in favor of SB 693, legislation that would require all new school buses purchased by a school district to be equipped with three-point seat belts.

The bill would amend the Transportation Code to expand the type of vehicles to which the three-point seat belt requirement applies to include a "multifunction school activity bus" or a "school-chartered bus."

Multiple school bus accidents in Texas have led to fatalities and caused injuries that could have been prevented if these buses were equipped with three-point seat belts, said the bill's author, Sylvia Garcia, D-Houston. "The goal of this legislation is to protect children, prevent injuries, and demonstrate that the State of Texas is serious about the safety of school children. We spend is about the safety of school children. We spend a lot of tax dollars educating children to buckle up Not requiring them buckle up on the way to school is inconsistent," she

Most natural diamonds Most natural diamonds are formed at high temperature and pressure at depths of 140 to 190 kilometers (87 to 118 mi) in the Earth's mantle. Carbon-containing minerals provide the carbon source, and the growth occurs over periods from 1 billion to 3.3 billion years (25% to 75% of the age of the Earth). Diamonds are brought close to the Earth's surface through deep volcanic

close to the Earth's surface through deep volcanic eruptions by magma, which cools into igneous rocks known as kimberlites and lamproites. The word is from the ancient Greek _%c_l\data^1 - adamas "unbreakable".

Diamonds have been treasured as gemstones since their use as religious icons in ancient India. Their usage in engraving tools also dates to early human history. The popularity of diamonds has risen since the 19th century because of increased supbecause of increased supply, improved cutting and polishing techniques, growth in the world econo-my, and innovative and successful advertising

successful advertising campaigns.
In 1772, the French scientist Antoine Lavoisier used a lens to concentrate the rays of the sun on a diamond in an atmosphere of oxygen, and showed that the only product of the combustion was carbon diamond the proving that diamond the combustion was carbon diamond. oxide, proving that diamond is composed of carbon. Later in 1797, the English chemist Smithson Tennant repeated and ex-panded that experiment. panded that experiments

Not all diamonds found on Earth originated on Earth Primitive interstellar meteorites were found to contain carbon possibly in the form of diamond. A type of diamond called carbonado that is found in

South America and Africa may have been deposited there via an asteroid impact (not formed from the impact) about 3 billion years ago. These diamonds may have formed in the intrastellar environment, but as of 2008, there was no scientific consensus on how carbonado diamonds originated.

Few diamonds are formed from highly compressed coal. More than 99% of diamonds ever mined have formed in the conditions of extreme heat and pressure about 90 miles (140 km) below the Earth's surface. Coal is formed from prehistoric plants buried much closer to the surface and is unlikely to migrate below 2 miles (3.2 km) through common geological procommon geological pro-cesses. Most diamonds that have been dated are older than the first land plants and are therefore older and are therefore older than coal. It is possible that diamonds can form from coal in subduction zones and in meteoroid impacts, but diamonds formed in this way are rare, and the carbon source is more likely carbonate rocks and organic carbon in sediments, rather than coal.
