HIGHLANDS — The San Jacinto River Coalition held their regular monthly meeting Tuesday night, with about 150 attending at the Community Center.

But instead of hearing information on the possible contamination in their well water, they had to wait a few more weeks, said Jackie Young. After attending a meeting with Harris County Public Health, she was unable to provide the definitive information that the audience asked for. They wanted a detailed quantitative report on dioxins, and other contaminants in their water.

100 wells have been tested by the county last month, and 71 of those received a letter advising them not to drink or cook

month, and 71 of those re-ceived a letter advising them not to drink or cook their water. Jackie Young, executive director of the group, gave a history of the organiza-

tion, her involvement, and status of the EPA study of the waste pits. She also played a video of Congressman Gene Green, questioning EPA

director Mathy Stanislaus on EPA's plans to remedi-ate the Superfund Site. The reply was that a study was almost complete, and an answer with a public

comment period would be ready by the end of sum-mer. Green emphasized the time critical nature of the remediation, since many people were experi-

encing health concerns and problems. His comment on the video to Stanislaus, "We want it cleaned up. We want it completely removed.

Public Health reproduced on page 8 of this issue.

Young also produced a letter from Congressmen Brian Babin, and Randy Weber, expressing the same sentiment and asking for complete removal. The Coalition is establishing a Memorial Display, to honor those who are sick or deceased from the environmental problems. The next meeting of the group is on August 23 at Walker Community Center. The topic is "ground water."

PASADENA, Texas Josh Huntley, a San Jacinto College forward, has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball at Stephen F. Austin University (SFA).

"Josh is a good ball player and an even better person," said Head Coach Scott Gernander, who has been at the helm of the San Jacinto College basketball program for four years. "He is a blue-collar player on the floor and brought the team great energy throughout the season."

As one of only three players to play in all 32 games last season, the 6-7 forward produced six double-double performances, averaging 10.3 points per game. He connected on 68.9 percent of his freethrows and 56.1 percent of his field goal attempts. He had 221 total rebounds, 85 of them on the offensive side, and 17 blocks. In his final game with the College, Huntley pulled down a career best 16 rebounds. Several colleges showed



interest in Huntley this past season. The Lauderdale Lakes, Florida (Deerfield Beach HS) native wisited Southern University and Texas Southern University before finally deciding to accept the offer from SFA.

"Josh was very patient in making his decision," said Gernander. "He wanted to make sure he found the right fit, and I'm glad

he found that in SFA."

Many boomers surprised by debt In retirement

Participation for minors will require parental con-sent.

Nelson, current chair of the state Senate Finance Committee and former chair of the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, said the program combines and streamlines two of the state's previous women's health programs to provide a full range of women's health services, including:

- Pregnancy testing and

- Pregnancy testing and counseling;
- Family planning;
- Immurizations;
- Breast and cervical cancer screenings;
- Screenings and treatment for diabetes, hypertension, and high cholesterol; and more.

"State funding for women's health services has reached an all-time high," said Sen. Nelson. "We have expanded our provider network to the largest it has ever been and will continue working to make sure women all over the state can access family planning and other preventative health services."

"We place a high priority on helping all Texas women access the comprehensive healthcare services they need," Smith said, "and we're committed to helping ensure more women know what benefits are available to help them take charge of their health."



CARING FOR STERLING SILVER

CRAING FOR STERLING SILVER

Clean your sterling silver jewelry with a soft 100% cotton (rub free) cloth or flannel cloth. Remember, silver is a very soft metal and you can scratch it if you aren't careful so don't not bit too briskly. Never use anything but a clean 100% cotton or a special sterling silver cleaning cloth or very soft bristle brush, like a baby's tooth brush or a horsehair silver brush. Paper, polyester, and caarse fabrics often contain wood fibers or synthetics that can cause thry scratches in the surface as well. Note: Focus on preventative care by storing your silver jewelry. In a closed box or plastic baggy as silver will tarnish when exposed to air.

DO'S AND DON'TS

Bridal jewelry, such as engagement rings and wedding bands are typically worn daily, and can appear like they ve lost their sparklei find to leaned on a regular basis. If you have questions, feel free to visit an expert Jeweler for advice on cleaning and care. Some jewelry stores will gladly recommend the best products and procedures to use when caring for your diamonds, to help keep them in great shape.

CARING FOR CUBIC ZITRONIA

Use a cotton or flannel cloth to wipe your jewelry clean. A special jewelry polishing cloth would be perfect (a popular choice is Sunshine Polishing Cloth). Using straight, back and forth strokes, polish your jewelry and remove any surface dirt and dust. Do not unto in a circular motion as that can scratch the surface of your jewelry. Then use a cleaning soldinot not remove any dirt and dust. Do not under a diamond, a cubic zirconia can be cleaned with warm water and mild soap. Use a soft, ossmetic applicator to reach reveroes. However, if you wish, you can use a trusted jewelry clean to remove any dirt and dust from your zirconium.

Store your jewelry in an airright, sealable plastic bag. If this is not possible, store your jewelry in a lined jewelry box, eavey from the outside air.

CARING FOR PEARLS

Pearls are very soft and need special care and attention. You should never store your pearls in a jewelry box next to other jewelry as the box and other pieces of jewelry can damage the pearls by cartacting and inchirg, Instead keep your pearl in a tabric lined box or flabric pounce.

ASK DIAMOND JIM

will gradually absorb acid from the skin that will eat into the pearl causing it to lose its luster. Wiping pearls off with either a well or dry soft cloth will prevent drift from accumulating and keep perspiration, which is slightly acidic, from eating away at the nacre. You can also use a drop of olive oil on your cleansing cloth to help maintain your pearls luster.

Along with being soft and easily scratched, pearls can be damaged by chemicals and heat. Only use jewilly cleaners that are clearly marked safe for pearls. Never use utrasonic cleansers, dish or wash detergents, bleaches, backing soda or ammonite based cleansers. Never use toothbrushes, or any other abrasive materials to clean your pearls. Always take off your pearls before using any cosmelics, hair spray, or perfume and avoid heat and dry air because both can cause pearls to turn brown, dry out, and crack.

CARING FOR RHODIUM

PLATED SILVER

Clean rhodium plated silver with warm water and a mild liquid soap (like vory dishwashing soap). Rinse and dry with a soft polishing cloth immediately to avoid mineral residue from the water.

CAHING FOR GEMSTONES
Gemstones are quite literally
hard as rock, buy they can be
damaged from careless handling
and negligence. Here are some
tips for keeping your gems and
jewelry looking fabulous for years
to come

and regulated. Had a some this for keeping your gems and jewely looking fabulous for years to come. Remember, even the hardest gemstone variety can be vulnerable to breakage if it has inclusions that weaken the crystal structure. Exercise common sense: if you have a ring set with a softer gem variety or an included stone, take it off before strenuous exercise. Even the hardest gem of them all, the diamond, can shatter or break in two with a single well-jaced blow. Never remove mings by pulling on the stone: that habit may result in a loose and then a lost gem. Most importantly, store each piece of gemstone jewelry separately so that harder stones don't scratch softer ones. Almost every gemstone is much harder than the metal it its set in. Gems can scratch the finish on your gold, silver or platinum if you throw your jewelry in a heap in a drawer or jewelry box.

Rings in particular tend to collect dust and soap behind the

in a heap in a drawer or jewelry box.

Rings in particular tend to collect dust and soap behind the gem, especially if worn often. You need to clean them regularly to let the light in so your gems can shine. To clean transparent crystalline gemstones, simply soak them in water with a touch of gentle dish soap. Use a bowl of water rather than the sink to eliminate the risk of anything going down the drain. If necessary, use a soft toothbrush to scrub behind the stone. Rinse the soap off and pat dry with a lim! Free cloth (you want to make sure threads won't catch on the prongs).

Think twice before putting gems in an ultrasonic cleaner. Diamonds, rubies and sapphires will be fine but many other gems many not be, in particular emerald, opal, pearls, and peridot: when in doubt, leave it out.

Organic gems like pearls, coral, and amber should only be wiped clean with a moist cloth. Due to their organic nature, these gems are both soft and porous. Be careful about chemicals in hairspray, cosmelics, or perfume: they can, over lime, damage pearls in particular. Opals also require special care. Never use an ultrasonic, never use ammonia, and avoid heat and strong light. Opaque gemstones like lapis lazuli, turquoise, and malachite, require special care because they are rocks, not crystals of a single mineral like transparent gems. These gem materials should just be wiped clean gently with a moist cloth. These gemstones can be porous and may absorb chemicals, even soap, and they may build up inside the stone and discolor it. Never use an ultrasonic cleaner and never use ammonia or any chemical solution.

CARING FOR STAINLESS STEEL.

Stainless steel jewelry won't rust but it can tarnish over time. Steel jewelry does not tarnish as tas silver jewelry but the rate of tarnishing depends on how its used. As with any jewelry it is best to avoid contact with chemicals (lottons, chlorine from pools etc.) in order to keep it cleaner longer. Steel jewelry is easy to clean, you can use mild dishwashing liquid (two or three drops in warm water will do) and wipe it down with a soft cloth. Steel jewelry over durable and can withstand a lot of wear and tear, as opposed to silver which is a very soft metal.

You recently participated in the Harris County Residential Drinking Water Well Sampling Project. Early testing indicates higher than acceptable levels of dioxins in your well water that may exceed safe drinking levels. However, due to a laboratory error, we will need to resample. The sample will be collected by InControl Technologies on Thursday, July 7, 2016.

Though current findings are inconclusive, <u>Harris County Public Health (HCPH) is recommending you use bottled water for drinking and cooking, and for your family pets.</u> Please note, boiling the water will not remove these contaminants.

You may continue to shower, bathe, or use the water for other purposes. <u>However, we ask that you refrain from ingesting your tap water until the results of the secondary test are concluded.</u>

Results of the new samples are expected within three weeks of collection. Once the results are received and analyzed, a representative from Harris County will contact you to discuss the next steps.
