## Donation from LyondellBasell enhances training for welding students

San Jacinto College weld-ing students have enhanced training options, thanks to stainless steel pipes recently donated by Lyondell-Basell Channelview. LyondellBasell donated stainless steel and standard carbon steel pines valued at

carbon steel pipes valued at approximately \$15,000, which will be used in train-ing San Jacinto College welding technology stu-

welding technology dents.
"The carbon steel pipes will be used for training stu-dents at every level, and the donation of the stainless dents at every level, and the donation of the stainless steel pipes is especially significant because it will be used in training advanced students, such as those learning Gas Tungsten Arc Welding," commented Eddie Foster, North Campus industrial technology department chair. "To my knowledge, it's the largest single donation of stainless steel pipes the North Campus has ever received."

Some of the donated carbon steel pipes have a thin layer of rust, which most steel acquires over time. "Rust on the carbon steel does not diminish the value of the pipe for training purchases"

"Rust on the caroon suesa-does not diminish the value of the pipe for training purposes," commented Foster. "Most things made of steel will develop a surface layer of rust over time, but the rust can be easily removed by surface grinding."

I am 8 years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says, "If you see it in The Sun, it's so." Please tell me the truth, is there a Santa Claus?

Virginia, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except they see They think that nothing can be which is not com prehensible by their little minds. All minds, Virginia whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this



great universe of ours, man is a mere insect, an ant, in his intellect as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole of truth and knowledge. at universe of ours man is

Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! how dreary would be the world if there were no Santa Claus! It would be as dreary as if there were no Virginias. There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We should have no enjoyment, except in sense and sight. The eternal light with which childhood fills the world would be extinguished.

Not believe in Santa Claus! You might as well not believe in fairies. You might get your papa to hire men to watch in all the chimneys on Christmas eve to catch Santa Claus, but even if you did not see Santa catch Santa Claus, but even if you did not see Santa Claus coming down, what would that prove? Nobody sees Santa Claus, but that is no sign that there is no Santa Claus. The most real things in the world are those that neither children nor men can see. Did you ever see fairies dancing on the lawn? Of course not, but that's no proof that they are not there. Nobody can conceive or imagine all the wonders there are unseen and unseeable in the world.

You tear apart the baby's rattle and see what You tear apart the baby's rattle and see what makes the noise inside, but there is a veil covering the unseen world which not the strongest man, nor even the united strength of all the strongest men that ever lived could tear apart. Only faith, poetry, love, romance, can push aside that curtain and view and picture the supernal beauty and glory beyond. Is it all real? Ah, Virginia, in all this world there is nothing else real and abiding.

No Santa Claus! Thank God! he lives and lives forever. A thousand years from now, Virginia, nay 10 times 10,000 years from now, he will continue to make glad the heart of childhood.

Francis P. Church's editorial, "Yes Virginia, There is a Santa Claus" was an immediate sensation, and went on to became one of the most famous editorials ever written. It first appeared in the The New York Sun in 1897, almost a hundred years ago, and was reprinted annually until 1949 when the paper went of the propers. out of business.

Virginia O'Hanlon went on to graduate from Hunter College with a Bachelor of Arts degree at age 21. The following year she received her Master's from Columbia, and in 1912 she began teaching in the New York City and the Arts had sure her began teaching in the New York City school system, later becoming a principal.
After 47 years, she retired as an educator. Throughout her life she received a steady stream of mail about
her Santa Claus letter, and to each reply she attached an attractive printed copy of the Church editorial. Virginia O'Hanlon Douglas died on May 13, 1971, at the age of 81, in a nursing home in Valatie, N.Y.





# Abbott backs Cruz's filing of legislation addressing refugees

AUSTIN — Gov. Greg Abbott was in Washington, D.C., on Dec. 8 to participate in a news conference with U.S. Senator and presidential candidate Ted Cruz, R-Texas, who rolled out his proposed State Refugee Security Act.

Abbott said in a Dec. 9 news release that Cruz's bill "gives states and governors the tools to reject the resettlement of a refugee in that state unless there is adequate assurance that the refugee does not present a security risk."

"America is a charitable nation, but we cannot allow charity for some to compromise security for all," Abbott said. "Congress intended to give states a substantial role in the refugee resettlement process.

The federal government
and resettlement agencies
have sidestepped that role.
My top priority as governois to keep Texas citizens
safe and this legislation
helps me do that," he added.
Cruz's bill, S. 2363, directs the federal Office of
Refugee Resettlement to
notify the state agency responsible for coordinating
the placement or resettlement of an alien refugee
not later than 21 days before the alien's arrival in
the state. The bill states
that no alien refugee shall
be placed or resettled in a
state if the governor certifies to the Office of Refugee Resettlement that it
has failed, in the sole determination of the govern
or, to provide adequate
assurance that such person does not present a security risk to the state.
On Nov. 25, the Texas
Catholic Conference, the
public policy voice of Texas' Catholic bishops, published a statement, saying,
"We firmly believe that it
is possible to maintain security at home while also
welcoming refugees."

"Remittances from other sectors, including construction, restaurants and retail trade, continued to grow. The net decrease in sales tax receipts is in line with the October Certification Revenue Estimate."


