## School superintendents speak at Chamber

Superintendents of the three school district in the North Channel area were the featured speakers last Friday at the Chamber's monthly luncheon.

Emcee for the luncheon, held at the San Jacinto College student union, was former Chamber chairman Charles Grant. He is now heading up a membership drive for the chamber, entitled Forty for Forty in Four. This is a reference to the 40th anniversary of the chamber, and the goal of adding 40 new members in four weeks. With a sly sense of humor, Grant has offered to "Kiss A Pig" if the chamber board and members meet this goal.

Grant was followed by each of the superintendents of the three school districts, and they exhibited a tongue-in-cheek rivalry in their remarks.



SPEAKERS at the North Channel Chamber luncheon last week were Greg Ollis, Channelview ISD superintendent; King Davis, Sheldon ISD superintendent; Angli Williams, Galena Park ISD superintendent; Charles Grant, former president of the Chamber, and Shalonda Dawkins, 1st vice chair of the Chamber.

Galena Park ISD's Angli Williams was the first speaker. She referred to the winners produced by GPISD, both in athletics and in academics.

GPISD has 22,000 students, 3000 employees, and a \$204 million budget, having a big impact on the community. The district passed a \$290 million bond issue to upgrade their facilities, she said.

Dr. King Davis reported on the Sheldon District, of which he has only been superintendent since January. His motto is "Every Child, Every Day" with emphasis on personalized learning opportunities.

Growth is the main factor for Sheldon ISD, with projections of 7% expansion in the current year. Sheldon ISD recently

## Barbara Mae Street sidewalk project completed

SaferStreets2Schools is a Precinct 2 program that partners with local school districts to improve areas with high student-pedestrian traffic. Commissioner Morman meets with the school districts at least once a year to discuss necessary improvements for the area. "We very much value their input, as they see firsthand how we can improve the safety and efficiency of getting our children to and from school," said Commissioner Morman. The \$112,000 project, which was in partnership with the Galena Park Independent School District, began in late June. It included the installation of a sidewalk on the east side of Barbara Mae Street from Holly Park Drive to Alderson Street.

# Man killed in parking lot of Jack in the Box

A man was killed during an argument in the parking lot of the Jack in the Box fast food restaurant last Sunday, police said.

According to police, the argument led to a shootout around 11:30 p.m. that killed the man at the restaurant near Federal Road

and I-10 intersection.

Houston Police said two groups of people were fighting and this escalated to the shootout.

The victim, a 22-year-old Migule Angel Cid, was taken to a nearby hospital where he later died.

Witness said the gunfire exchange was inside a car. Cid was then pushed out of the car, and tried to left the scene while firing to the car, he collapsed and was picked up by a car driven by his brother who took him to the hospital.

An aura of mystery has always surrounded these rare natural wonders, so it was quite an honor when GIA researchers examined them.

**The Hope Diamond**

The Hope Diamond may be the most famous colored diamond in the world. A team of GIA gemologists graded it in 1988. Because they were able to weigh the diamond unmounted, they quickly made a notable discovery: the diamond was 45.52 ct, and not 44.50 ct, which had been its previously recorded weight. GIA graders also reported that the Hope Diamond is a cushion antique brilliant. The diamond was color graded as a natural color Fancy dark grayish blue diamond.

Since the 1800s, the Hope Diamond had been described as being flawless. During their examination, the GIA team noticed that the diamond had accumulated a few wear marks over the years and had whitish graining and a few minor feathers. Its clarity was graded as VS1 (Very slightly included). Good polish and Fair to Good symmetry were also noted. Technical specifications aside, the Hope Diamond captivates the imagination like no other gemstone.

**The Dresden Green**

The Dresden Green  
In late 1988, GIA gemologists secured permission to examine the famed Dresden Green diamond in the Green Vaults, which was then in East Germany. They were particularly excited, as it promised to provide insight into distinguishing natural from laboratory-irradiated green diamonds (radiation is usually the cause of color in both instances). Because the diamond's history had been recorded since 1741, researchers could be confident that it had not been treated in a laboratory. As the diamond remained mounted upon examination, GIA gemologists were not able to issue a grading report.

GIA researchers described the Dresden Green as Fancy green, with a modified pear-shaped brilliant cut. The natural green color has medium tone and slightly grayish saturation. The Green Vaults records indicate it weighs 41 ct.

**The Portuguese Diamond**

Of South African origin, the Portuguese Diamond weighs 127.01 ct. GIA gemologists graded it an M on the GIA Color Scale, and gave it a VS1 clarity grade because of a small bruise on one of the facets and two very minor scratches on the table.

The Portuguese has Very Strong blue fluorescence, and this may help mask the faint yellow color in the diamond. Because the fluorescence is so strong, in 1924 it was advertised by Black, Starr & Frost to be a blue diamond.

**Idol's Eye**

Another famous diamond shrouded in myth, the Idol's Eye was probably mined in India's Golconda District – an area famed for producing fine diamonds. There are many tall tales about the diamond, including one that says the Idol's Eye is also the Nassak. This has been disproven. The first confirmed documentation of the Idol's Eye was in one of the lots being sold at auction by Christie's London in July 1865.

GIA gemologists confirmed that the Idol's Eye weighs 70.20 ct. Its color grade is Very Light blue and its clarity is VVS1 (Very very slightly included).

**The Moussaieff Red**  
5.11 ct  
The Moussaieff Red

Although the Moussaieff Red weighs just 5.11 ct, it's a predominantly red diamond (no secondary hues like purple), which means it's incredibly rare. A description of Fancy red is remarkable. GIA records show that from 1957 to 1987 there was no mention of a GIA report issued for a diamond with "red" as the only descriptive term.

Only a handful of Fancy red diamonds are known, because in diamonds the color red is often modified with another hue, such as purplish red or orange red.

A Brazilian farmer discovered the Moussaieff Red in the 1990s. It was cut and polished from a 13.9 ct crystal.

Guard Against Identity Theft - and Protect Your Finances

In 2015 alone, more than 13 million Americans were victimized by identity theft, according to the U.S. Department of Justice. What can you do to guard your identity and protect yourself from potential financial losses?

a digital "footprint." So, when you sell or otherwise dispose of a computer system or hard drive, you may want to take steps to destroy personal data. You might think that simply deleting it would be sufficient, but tech-savvy identity thieves can "undelete" files or recover information from a formatted drive. However, products are available that allow you to completely wipe out data on hard drives.

- Change passwords. It's a good idea to change your Internet passwords every so often – especially those passwords that provide access to financial accounts.

- Leave your Social Security card home. Snagging someone's Social Security number is a real "catch" for identity thieves, so do everything you can to thwart them. And you can start by leaving your Social Security card safely at home – after all, there's probably never a good reason to bring it out, anyway. In fact, be wary of anyone, or any business, that asks for your Social Security number, either in person or online. Except for a few obvious exceptions, such as your tax preparer, most reputable businesses don't need to know anything

about your Social Security information.

- Watch for "phishers." If you've ever gotten an e-mail, supposedly from your bank, advising you that your account will be "frozen" unless you provide personal details about your account, it's a good bet that someone is "phishing" for this information – and they're using the "freezing" threat as bait. What's particularly alarming is that these "phishers" have gotten quite good at duplicating logos and using official-sounding language. However, a legitimate bank would never threaten you this way with an e-mail, so, if you get such a message, contact the bank's fraud department.

You can go a long way toward protecting yourself against identity theft by following these suggestions – so put them to work soon.

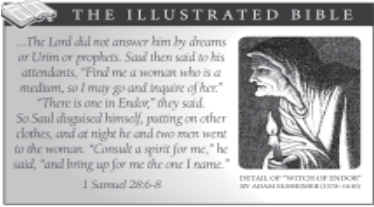

passed a \$285 million bond issue, for a new high school and other improvements and upgrades to facilities, safety, and technology, he said. King said that due to their growth, they now were rated by the UIL as a 6A school. They have 8900 students total.

Greg Ollis, superintendent of Channelview ISD, was the next speaker. He has been in office since 2008, and the district just passed a \$111 million bond issue.

The CISD motto is "One Passion... One Dream... One Heartbeat." The district now has 9500 students, adding 700 in the
