Senate candidate Beto O'Rourke in Channelview

CHANNELVIEW—Candidate for Texas Senator Beto O'Rourke held a Town Hall meeting last Tuesday, at Armenta's Reception Hall. Hundreds of supporters, and the curious, turned out for a warm greeting.

O'Rourke is on a 34-day grassroots drive across Texas, and Channelview was one of his few stops in this area. Beto has made a point of visiting all of the 254 counties in the state.

Although the crowd was mostly Democrats, many of them wearing "BetoforTexas" tee shirts, there were also some Republicans and Independents who tolds the North Channel Star they admired the man and message that Beto represents.

Beto gave a fiery speech, animated with arms waving, about his position on Veterans' rights, public education, better pay for teachers, and universal healthcare.

Beto noted that his campaign is funded entirely by individuals, and not PACs or special interests, in contrast to his opponent. in-

cumbent Senator Ted Cruz. O'Rourke said that so far he has raised more than \$10.4 million dollars for his campaign, almost twice what Cruz raised.

In addition, polls are now showing that he is within 4 points of potential

votes, with the latest being a poll taken by NBC news. The poll gave Beto 45% of the vote, with 49% for Cruz, and 6% undecided. Beto claims that as the general election in November approaches, he will pick up the difference.



6 Tips to Keep Children Safe in Digital World

With the increase in cyberbullying, parents worry about the safety of their children in the digital world. Technology and digital devices are ingrained in our children's daily lives from an early age. David McGeary, curriculum director for Digital Education and Innova tion at Harris County Department of Education, provides safety tips to help keep children from harm and be good digital citizens.

1.Talk to kids about digital safety at a young age and do it often.

Have parents talk to kids about what to do if something happens online. If students are at school, tell a trusted teacher. If something happens at home, tell a parent or other trusted

Talk to children about their district's code of conduct and safety plans. If the district has an anonymous tip line, how do you access it? What kind of information should be shared? If the district maintains an account for routine safety updates or communications during an event, where is that social media channel located? How can parents engage that channel to stay informed or share information?

The Department of Homeland Security publicizes its "See Something, Say Something" initiative. Not only is it a good practice to follow this advice for personal safety, a student's report could save lives of others through conscientious sharing of information.

2. Be a part of your children's online experiences. Know the sites they visit and games they play.

Research shows that kids ages 12-17 are increasingly aware of the disparity between the "perfect life" that they see others share online and the "real life" they experience every day. Parents should work to remind their kids that social media is often a reflection of a person's best experiences, but it does not represent the whole person. Kids should learn to cherish themselves, flaws and all. All this while also keeping an open mind about what is happening on social media

3. Don't allow young children to spend unsupervised time

Keep the family computer in a common area in the home. Keep charging devices out of private areas like

4. Enforce this rule: If

you won't do something face-to-face, don't do it online. (Discuss social interactions.)

Research shows that victims of cyberbullying have often bullied someone online themselves. By humanizing the online space and developing empathy for others, parents can help their children break the cycle of victim-andvictimization.

5. Humanize online social interactions. Remind them that behind every pixelated avatar is a human being.

When kids begin to get more active on social media, help them to use social media in a healthy way. Encourage them to share snaps of things that they are interested in or Instagram posts of cool experiences they have. Social media is becoming increasingly important in the world after high school. Help kids to share the best versions of themselves online so they may be etter positioned for a life outside of school once they graduate.

6. Parents and students: Be fierce guardians of your personal information.

If a student is being asked to use a thirdparty tool that requires the student to give out personal information, it's okay to ask if the district has a policy in place to protect the information that is being given away. Parents can further help their kids by reading the "terms of service and privacy policy." (This policy is usually found at the very bottom of a web page or in the settings of an application on any website that a student uses outside of their district's network.)

McGeary suggests that while children may be getting information about safe online behavior from their school, students who have regular discussions with their parents about digital safety are more likely to be vigilant, selfadvocates when something goes wrong online. He also suggests parents become partners in their child's online experienc-

"Take interest in the sites your children visit and the games they play," said McGeary. "If kids are engaged in constant discussion about the digital realm, they are much more likely to approach a parent or guardian if something out of the ordinary occurs."

Texas Education Agency releases two sets of ratings

AUSTIN — The Texas Education Agency on Aug. 15 released 2018 campus accountability ratings and, for the first time ever, A-F district accountability rat-

ings.
More than 8,700 independent school campuses received a rating of Met Standard, Met Alternative Standard or Improvement Required. Some 7,260 public school campuses and 558 charters were rated Met Standard or Met Alternative Standard, while 293 public school campuses and 56 charters were rated Improvement Required. Some 86 campuses would have received an Improvement Required rating but were affected by Hurricane Harvey to an extent that they were la-beled Not Rated: Harvey Provision. Also, 506 campuses received a Not Rated label for reasons other than Hurricane Harvey.

$\mathbf{T}_{ ext{op performers}}$ lauded

Some 153 Texas school districts and district charters received an "A" rating under the A-F state accountability system, Education Commissioner Mike Morath announced.
"Achieving an A rating

reflects the hard work and commitment of everyone within a school district, starting with our class-room teachers," Morath said. "We should all celebrate the outstanding work of these dedicated educators. Districts with high levels of poverty who attain this high level of performance are proof positive that poverty is not destiny. With strong instruction and curriculum, all students can succeed.'

The A-F ratings are based numerical grades in three areas: Student Achieve-

ment, showing how much students know and are able to do at the end of the school year;
— School Progress,

showing how students per-form over time and how that growth compares to similar schools; and

- Closing the Gaps, showing how well different school are performing

Safe driving is promoted

The Texas Department of Transportation has renewed its annual effort to prevent drunken driving during the Labor Day holiday weekend.

TxDOT Executive Director James Bass on Aug. 16 said, "It's completely irresponsible and absolutely inexcusable to drink and drive. Finding a sober ride is easy, and it can save you from being arrested or from injuring or killing yourself or others. Make

an effort to plan ahead for a sober ride this Labor Day weekend. You owe it to yourself and everyone else on the road.'

Bass promoted the agency's anti-drinking and driving "Plan While You Can" campaign and recommended the website SoberRides.org as a source of alternatives to drinking and driving, such as:

Designating a sober driver or calling someone for a sober ride home;

Contacting a taxi or ride-share service;

 Using mass transit; and

-Spending the night. Bond rating is highest Texas has received the highest credit ratings for this year's Texas Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, allowing the state to manage its cash flow needs for fiscal 2019.

State Comptroller Glenn Hegar made the announcement on Aug. 10, saying the ratings issued by the financial services companies Standard & Poor's, Fitch, Moody's and Kroll are the result of "conservative economic leadership and sound policies."

The notes are sold to help fund school payments and manage cash flow between the start of the fiscal year and the arrival of tax revenue later in the year. This year's \$7.2 billion TRAN sale is set for Aug. 22.



Last week, I could not bring myself to write my column. I received phone calls and emails asking if I was okay. I love this community in such a way that it hurts to know there are some people who have issues in their lives and they do not know where to turn for

On the morning of August 12, I was reading the news on my phone before church started. There had been a murder in our community the night before. To make it even worse, the young mother was stabbed to death in the presence of her four youngest children---by their father My heart broke and my mind started racing. So many things crossed my mind. Who was going to raise these children? Where were her other two children? If the relationship had been abusive, why did she not reach out? If she reached out and the shelters for domestic violence victims were full, had she contacted any law enforcement officers? Had she told her apartment staff that she had someone who could potentially hurt her? Did she talk to a judge about

At the end of the church service, Pastor Johnny Brady asked for the women of the church on to explain that there was a precious 12-yeargrandmother. She had lost her mother the night before to murder. It hit me like a ton of bricks that this girl was one of at home when their mother was killed. After the prayer, I spoke to the grandmother. I offered her the name of Bo's Place which provides counseling for children

As the day went on, I learned so much about Sofie. By the time the funeral took place on Friday night, I had heard so many awesome stories children and her family. 1 heard from neighbors and classmates. I heard from first responders. I heard from others that had suffered with these relationships. hurt I was when on Sunday, following a fundraiser for Sofie's children, I learned that their father's family had

getting a protective When her younger sister asked so many questions. all I could do was remind her that God sees everything and in time, we will understand. She and her to come forward. He went siblings have found an attorney to help with getting custody of the old girl at church with her children as well as filing a lawsuit against the local business that continued to serve him alcohol even though the video tape shows he was beyond the two older children not drunk. HARVEY'S ANNIVERSARY ★

Harvey Timeline

Aug. 13, 2017: Harvey began as a tropical wave off the west coast of Africa.
Aug. 17, 2017: The National Hurricane Center began tracking Tropical Cyclone

Aug. 17, 2017. The National Interface Center began tracking Propical Cyclone Nine. Later that day the storm was named Tropical Storm Harvey.
 Aug. 18, 2017: Tropical Storm Harvey hit the Windward Islands and entered the eastern Caribbean Ocean as a minimal tropical storm.
 Aug. 19, 2017: Tropical Storm Harvey dissipated into a tropical wave.

Aug. 23, 2017: Harvey reformed into a tropical depression after hitting the warm waters of the Bay of Campeche and the western Gulf of Mexico. The governor of Texas issued a state disaster declaration for 30 counties.

 Aug. 24, 2017: Tropical Storm Harvey strengthened into a hurricane. FEMA established an Incident Support Base at Randolph Auxiliary Airfield near Seguin, Texas, to pre-position supplies including water, meals, blankets and other resources closer to the potentially affected areas, should they be needed and requested by the state. State and local officials would then be responsible for distributing any supplies to their communities

 Aug. 25, 2017: Harvey became a Category 3 major hurricane and quickly gained strength to become a Category 4 storm. That night, Harvey made landfall on San Jose Island between Port Aransas and Port O'Connor as a Category 4 hurricane. Harvey made a second landfall at Holiday Beach as a Category 3 storm. The president issued a major disaster declaration for the State of Texas.

• Aug. 26, 2017: FEMA's Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA) began in Texas Harvey weakened into a tropical storm. More than 15 inches of rain fell over Sar

Patricio, Refugio, Nueces and Aransas counties as Harvey headed north toward Victoria County. The governor added 20 more counties to the state declaration.

• Aug. 27, 2017: FEMA mobilized four Incident Command Teams, worked with the State of Texas to develop an evacuation and support plan, supported the state with a food task force, set up three Incident Support Bases and a Federal Staging Area in San Antonio (Joint Base San Antonio) and supported 100 shelters for evacuees. The governor adds four more counties to his state declaration. Over the next few days, Harvey dropped up to 60 inches of rain (North American record) in parts of southeast Texas including Fort Bend, Brazoria and Harris counties.

Aug. 28, 2017: The governor added four more counties to his state declaration. Fifteen to 25 inches of rain fell over much of Aransas, Refugio, San Patricio and Victo-

Aug. 29, 2017: Tropical Storm Harvey moved back into the Gulf of Mexico.

Harris County continues to focus on recovery and resiliency efforts as Hurricane Harvey's first year anniversary approaches

 $(Houston, TX) - As\ Hur$ ricane Harvey's first year anniversary approaches, the Harris County Office of Homeland Security & **Emergency Management** (HCOHSEM) reflects on this historic storm that devastated southeast Texas with unprecedented flooding and destruction. Harvey was the most extreme rain event in U.S. history - close to 50 inches of rain fell during a fourday period.

Harvey claimed 36 lives in Harris County alone and led to one of the largest rescue efforts in Texas history. More than 300,000 vehicles and up to 160,000 homes and businesses were damaged. Damages are expected to exceed \$125 billion.

"Harvey presented a tremendous test of strength for our region, especially for residents still trying to recover from pre-vious floods," said Harris County Judge Ed Emmett. "Our area had been impacted by severe flooding for three consecutive years prior to Harvey."

Harris County has had five declared disasters since 2015. A year after Harvey, it is clear that the

path to recovery continues and will require an unwavering effort from all levels of government, the public and private sector.

"Our priorities rest on helping communities recover and backing flood control projects to make our county more resilient," added Emmett. "We must all work together to accomplish this.

To date, the federal government has provided \$800 million in housing and other disaster related expenses, and close to \$260 million for public assistance projects. Most recently, an additional \$1.1 billion was granted to fund Harris County recovery projects.

Harris County will oversee the allocation of \$214 million in federal funds to help rebuild and repair single-family homes and an additional \$119 million will go toward the con-struction of new singlefamily homes. More than \$204.5 million will go to assist with damaged multifamily housing projects and affordable rental projects in areas affected by Harvey. Another \$200 million will go to purchasing homes that have flood

ed throughout the county. The Hurricane Harvey Relief Fund, established by Harris County Judge Ed $Emmett\ and\ Houston$ Mayor Sylvester Turner. has distributed more than \$110.5 million dollars to more than 100 local nonprofit organizations. This fund, now managed by the Greater Houston Community Foundation, helps with needs that are not met by other local and federal efforts.

"As we reflect on Harvey, we cannot forget the first responders, law enforcement, and communivolunteers who dedicated their time to response and recovery," said Emmett. "It is this neighbor helping neighbor spirit that helped us get through this year.

She says she will run the "People's Court" with Integrity, Respect for Everyone, and a Welcoming or Inviting attitude.


Bates noted that becoming a JP is more than winning an election, and she has been studying hard on an internet course meant for first-time Justices of the Peace.
