tangs came out on the field




The Mustang offense was hitting on all cylinders as running back Zach Evans ran for 196 yards


and four touchdowns. while sophomore quarterback Dematrius Davis gave them plenty of bal-ance with 231 passing

## Texas' top lawyer cheers court ruling against Obamacare

AUSTIN — Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton applauded a Dec. 14 Fort Worth federal district court decision declaring unconstitutional the U.S. Affordable Care Act, widely known as "Obamacare."

Ten months ago, Paxton and Wisconsin Attorney General Brad Schimel led a 20-state coalition lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the 2010 health care law, arguing that Congress rendered all of Ohamacare unconstitutional by doing away with the tax penalty in Obamacare's individual mandate when it enacted President Donald Trump's tax over-

"Today's ruling halts an unconstitutional exertion of federal power over the American healthcare system," Attorney General Paxton said. "Our lawsuit seeks to effectively repeal Obamacare, which will give President Trump and Congress the opportunity to replace the failed social experiment with a plan that ensures Texans and all Americans will again have greater choice about what health coverage they need and who will be their doctor."

 $Supporters\ of\ the\ health$ care law said the federal district court's ruling would be appealed.

TEA releases ratings The Texas Education Agency on Dec. 12 released its final 2018 state academic accountability ratings for 1,200 school districts and charters and more than 8,700 campus-

Preliminary state accountability ratings were announced by TEA in August. The final ratings include results of an appeals process that provides districts and charters an opportunity to contest preliminary ratings.

The Texas Education Agency received 172 school district and campus-level to 66 in 2017.

#### Revenue is distributed

Comptroller Glenn Hegar on Dec. 12 announced he would send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts some \$761 million in local sales tax allocations for the month of December.

The amount is 9.5 percent more than the amount reported by the Office of the Comptroller in December 2017. Allocations are based on sales made in October by businesses that report tax monthly.

December 19, 2018 -These few Home Holiday Crime Prevention Tips is meant to help you have a happy holiday season. For sure there's lots of "criminal scrooges watching the neighborhoods for the careless holiday season resident, don't be their victim.

Don't open your door to strangers, be aware that criminals sometimes pose as couriers delivering gifts, even wearing a company uniform they've stolen or bought at a garage sale.

Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave your house or apartment, even for a few minutes.

When returning home after a shopping trip, have the house keys in your hand, ready to use when you reach the door. you might have been followed from the store by a criminal.

Leave lights turned on both inside and outside your residence after dark Criminals don't like bright places.

If you will be away from home for several days, make arrangements for someone to pick up your mail and newspapers. An overstuffed mailbox is a sure sign that no one is home, and burglars are tempted to check those envelopes for holiday gifts.

Keep your blinds or curtains closed, don't openly display your tree and gifts in the front window so they are easily visible from the street. It's too tempting for a potential criminal to smash the window and grab the wrapped packages...or plan a later break-in based on their earlier observation.

advertise...burglars look for occupancy cues like outdoor lights burning 24 hours a day, piled up newspapers, mail, or advertising flyers hang ing on the door knob.

Use an inexpensive light timer to turn on and off a light when you are away and ask a neighbor to pick up your newspa-pers and mail.

If you go out for the evening, turn on lights and a radio or television so the house or apartment appears to be occupied.

Be mindful of burning candles and too many lights plugged into outlets/extension cords, these are on the Top 10 Causes of House Fires.

Burglars know to look for the hidden door key near the front entrance Don't hide spare keys under rocks, in flowerpots, or above door ledges Instead give the spare key to a trusted neighbor.

Burglars prefer to enter through unlocked doors or windows. A holiday problem can occur when exterior Christmas light extension cords are run inside through a window that prevents it from being secured.

The after opening presents, don't pile up empty gift boxes from your new computer, DVD player, or stereo receiver on the street for the garbage collector. Bur-glars appreciate knowing that you have expensive gifts inside for them to steal. Break the boxes down or cut them up to conceal the items better.


