an improvement. Junior quarterback Wyndell Mitchell completed 70 percent of his passes for 158 yards (yds), but the running game continues to be the strength for his offense making 433 yds and 9 TD's combining for 591 yds.

back Jacoby Davis intercepted a Wildcat pass for a TD. The Wildcats lone score came from a blocked punt return for a TD.

## Arrests made in two Uvalde murder cases

### Arrest in runover death at McDonald's

HOUSTON -- A man has been arrested and charged in connection with the murder of a 71-year-old woman who was robbed and run over at a McDonald's on Uvalde Road in east Harris County. On Sept. 23, deputies said Martha Medina was run over and killed after being robbed at a McDonald's restaurant located at 430 Uvalde.

Andrew Williams, 40, has been charged with capital murder. Sheriff Ed Gonzalez with the Harris County Sheriff's Office said Williams was arrest-



ed Tuesday and taken to the Harris County jail. Sheriff Gonzalez said Williams was out on bond in connection to a previous

capital murder when Medina was killed.

According to court documents, Williams shot and killed Chima Ogbonnaya with a firearm while attempting to rob another man. In that case, Bond initially was denied, but later granted at \$150,000 on Jan. 21, according to court documents. Williams' previous capital murder case was being tried in Harris County 248th District Court by Judge Hilary Unger. Unger was elected to the bench in November 2018.

### Arrest in carjacking, dragging death

HOUSTON -- Charges have been filed against a suspect arrested in the death of a woman at 557 Uvalde Road about 2:45 p.m. on Tuesday (Sept. 28).

The suspect, Marcus Wayne Brock (b/m, 55), is charged with capital murder in the 176th State District Court.

The victim is identified as Jessica Garza, 41.

HPD Homicide Division Detectives J. Caten and M. Barrow reported:

Officers were dispatched to a robbery call to the above address. They



were advised that Ms. Garza picked up a family member at a church in the 900 block of Uvalde Road when

a male suspect ran across the street and attempted to get inside of Garza's vehicle. It is believed that Garza attempted to stop the suspect or got stuck in her vehicle as the suspect drove it away.

The suspect is believed to have hit multiple objects before coming to a stop at the above address where he then fled on foot. Garza was found deceased outside of her vehicle. Officers apprehended the suspect a short time later. He was questioned and subsequently charged.

Community is Everything

When someone in the family hurts, every member of the family hurts. When there is something to celebrate, the entire family celebrates. One thing I have learned in my 50 years of living in the North Channel Area is that our lives become intertwined in many ways and before you know it, we begin to feel like family.

Building a network of those who think like you and hold the same values is important, yet I have learned that if your entire circle of influence is a duplicate of yourself, nothing changes. Diversity is so important. Yet even with diversity, you can have unity. When I talk about how many people work together using their skills and gifts, I am reminded of the words of a North Shore legend, Pastor John Brady. For more than 40 years he was the pastor at Woodforest Baptist Church and one of the messages he shared quite often was “Everybody in the Body has a gift and it takes everybody to make it happen.” He would break it down that in a human body, there are eyes to see, ears to hear and while we have feet, they do not serve the same purpose as hands.

In the past few years, our community has endured celebrations as well as devastating situations, yet we always manage to pull together and our resilience shine forth. I am blessed that in the past few years, I met Kristina Zatopek while volunteering with Cory Redding’s 3D Football Camp. Years later, when volunteers have been needed, I could count on Kristina to help round them up. Later, we both attended several John Maxwell Mastermind Groups and quite a few projects with East Harris County Empowerment Council to help our neighbors with emergency relief efforts.

I also met Luz Marie Lopez during community projects and quickly learned that if you need to reach the Spanish speaking community members, especially in Cloverleaf, Luz it the one to make it happen. She has successfully organized the past Community Town Hall events at the Baldree Center and if attendance is an indicator, she is the one to get community members there. All of the events have had residents of all ages as well as organizations and businesses that provide services to these community members. I cannot begin to count how many times I have referred someone to her for translation especially of documents.

Another example I want to share is of how Karla Green and I met. Years ago, her son Jeramy was a waiter at a local restaurant. Every week after church my children as well as a large group from church would show up. He learned our family’s order and never forgot. He was just a young man in high school at the time yet he became family. He has a spirit of wanting to be of service. About a year after I met him, I was reading the obituaries in the newspaper and I saw his name listed as a survivor of the deceased. It was his father and I knew immediately I needed to attend the service. Upon arriving, he introduced me to his mother. The rest is history. I saw in Karla a desire to get involved and use her gifts to help others.

Tuesday night at National Night Out, the four of us were present at the Baldree Center and so many people kept asking if we were related. Paul Lachapelle, the Community Center Coordinator summed it up simply “Sharing is caring. We are in this together, anything for OUR community.”

ASK DIAMOND JIM

Diamond Jim: “What are Gems?”

Gems are Beautiful, Rare, and Durable

Almost all gems are minerals but, very few minerals are gems. To be a gem, a mineral must be beautiful, rare, and durable. When a gem is rare, it’s hard to find and some gems are much harder to find than others.

**Rough**

Most rough gems are crystals and their shapes depend on their chemical structures. Aquamarine and emeralds come in hexagonal (six-sided) shapes, while diamonds and spinel are often octahedrons, for example. Not all rough gems are crystals – lapis lazuli is rock and amber is fossilized resin.

**Cut and Polished**

Gem crystals can be cut and polished into shiny gems. When a gem is cut, it is referred to as a fashioned gem. Skillful fashioning can show off a gem’s luster or color.

**A Few More Interesting “Gem” Facts**

- Gems are found in several places around the world. Brazil, India, Australia, and Madagascar are good sources of gems. Even the USA produces certain gems.
- The state of Florida took on the Moonstone Gem as their state gem to tie in with their role in the lunar program which allowed men to walk on the moon.
- The Thunderegg is Oregon’s State Rock. This gem was said to have been made by the Thunder Spirits who lived in the craters where this gem is formed. The Sunstone is Oregon’s official gem-stone
- In 1991 a single Garnet was discovered in Virginia weighing more than 2,800 carats. It was named the Rutherford Lady.
- The largest Diamond discovered in the USA is the Uncle Sam Diamond. It originally weighed more than 40.23 carats. It was found at the Crater of Diamonds State Park in Arkansas.
- The Dom Pedro which is the world’s largest cut and polished Aquamarine stone weighs in at a little more than 10,000 carats and is a part of the Smithsonian’s National Gem and Mineral Collection.


