Man gets life sentence for murder at Uvalde McDonald's

HOUSTON - A man who was found guilty Monday for the 2021 murder of a 71 -year-old woman in east Harris County has
been sentenced to life in been sentenced to life in
prison without parole. Anprison without parole. An
drew Williams, 41, was convicted of capital murder in the death of Martha Medina.
On Sept. 23, 2021, Medina was run over and killed after being robbed of her purse at a McDonald's Uvalde. "They grabbed at 430 Uvalde. "They grabbed her
purse, she fell toward the purse, she fell toward the
front of the car that was going out, and in a hurry to get away, they ran over her," Adrian Medina, the victim's son, said. She was taken to a near HCSO said. A McDonald's employee who asked not to be identified said she stayed by the victims side
during her final during her final moments. "I told her I'm going to pray
for you and she said I'm grateful for that, I don't want to die," said the fast food employee Authorities said the sus pect fled the scene in a

dark-colored Chevrolet Impala with black rims. According to Harris County Sheriff Ed Gonzalez, Williams was out on bond in connection to a previous capital mur-
der, in 2019, when Medina was killed der, in 2019, when Medina was killed.
Court documents show that Williams shot and killed Chima Ogbonnaya with a fire arm while attempting to rob another man. His bond was initially denied, but later granted at $\$ 150,000$ on Jan. 2 . Liliana Medina, the victim's daughter said she feels satisfied but not happy be
cause two families are still suffering from cause two families are still suffering from
this incident. She said she also feels bad for Williams' family because they are also victims.
"All I can say is that I feel satisfied. Do feel happy? No. Because it's two fami lies that are still suffering," Liliana Me dina told KPRC 2 in Spanish. "Not only my family is still suffering, but I also feel bad for his (Williams') family as well, be,
cause at the end, they're also the victims.'

Diamond Jim: "What Makes a

Light My Fire: Understanding A Diamond In Light

When light leaves the sun, it races towards the earth at 186,000 miles per second. When it hits the diamond in front of you, it slows down to 77,000 miles per second. That speed dironds bends, reflects, refracts, and breaks apart into rainbows of color. Light is what gives us a diamond's brilliance, scintillation, and dispersion
Of course, when I'm talking about light in diamonds, I'm talking about the cut. Each facet that a cutter polishes onto a diamond is designed to eflect light, bounce it around the diamond, and up to your eyes. Even one facet out of alignment can result in light that doesn't perform the way it is so essential to understanding the optics and the beauty of diamonds, the type of light matters.
This is the most overlooked part of understandng the quality of diamonds. But you have the perfect instrument to analyze the impact of ligh on diamond quality: your eyes.


Look and Look Again
Diamond facets are like mirrors: they reflect what's around them. When you look at a diamond from far away, it reflects the room and environment around you. When you look at a diamond close up, you're seeing a reflection of yourself. You'll be able to see the color you are wearing reflected in the diamonds facets. Diferences in all diamonds look great. They flash and sparkle and throw off rainbows. You can't judge whether o not a diamond is well cut by looking at it in direct sunlight.
The light in an office is efficient but generally not flattering for diamonds (or for people!). Usual y, it's diffused light that bounces off the ceiling With diffuse or scattered lighting, a diamond's brilliance is more visible. Light enters the diamond from multiple directions, downplaying shadows and decreasing fire
Candlelight and warm home lighting are good for people and for diamonds. You won't see optimum brilliance but you will get sparkle. Diamond with larger facets like old European cuts and merald cuts will look especials
lower lighting environments.
Daylight or indirect sunlight from a window, especially a north window which provides more tant light for looking at diamonds. It's bright enough to assess its brilliance and scintillation without those blingy reflections that blind you to the areas where light is leaking and not being reflected back to the eye. A diamond that's beautiful in daylight will also be beautiful in every other light. That's why diamond dealers sort diamonds only in north light.
Which diamond looks most beautiful to you is personal: you may prefer one facet pattern to another. Diamonds have different rhythms to their scintillation and different personalities. I gravitate
to step cuts and you might like the crushed ice look of a radiant cut. There's no wrong answer, it's just a personal choice.

Iregularly talk to well-informed people who do not realize that world population growth is
rapidly slowing and that global population peak sometime between now and the end of the entury. Currently, the UN estimates the most kely case is that the world's population will top ou around 10 billion in 2080 and then begin a long, slow decline. Other modelers are projecting the peak will be reached in 2060 at 9 billion and then decline more rapidly. Some scenarios predict there will be fewer peopl
The UN's predictions for the U.S. are similar with our population topping out at around 380 million near the end of the century. This is consistions, which assume the U.S. annual population rowth rate over the next 20 years will decline from $5 \%$ to $.2 \%$. Without immigration, the U.S. population would begin to decline around 2035.
Many of us grew up reading the Ehrlichs' Populaion Bomb, which predicted a worldwide apocalypse was just around the corner. The book, written in ll of humanity is over In the 1970s hundreds of millions of people will starve to death..." Of course, that did not happen and since around 2000 , reearchers have found there have been more obese people in the world than those who are undernour

In part, it did not happen because of an explosion of agricultural technology in the 1950s and 1960s known as the Green Revolution. But the Ehrlichs
prediction also never came to pass because they missed that by the time they were writing their book, women had already begun having fewer babies.
The critical metric for population growth is the verage number of children women are having at Other factors, such as childhood survival and longevity, also affect population growth but the ertility rate is the big driver. It takes a fertility rat of 2.1 children per woman to maintain a stable population, known as the "replacement rate." Anything above that and the population will grow
and below that it falls.
When the Ehrlichs wrote their book the fertility rate was stunningly high at 5 . That astronomical rate would go on to cause the world population to
double just 40 years later. But what was not appa ent to the Erhlichs at the time was that the fertility rate had peaked about five years earlier at 5.3. That began a steady slide downward to 2.3 today, just barely above the replacement rate.
However, a decline in fertility rate does not show $u p$ at once. It takes a while for that lower rate to work through the generational cycle, something ou still see a hefty $25 \%$ increase in the world's opulation in the projections before it tops out in 2080.

Many countries around the world are already beginning to feel the effects of slowing population growth. Japan and Russia both face looming drastic population declines. China announced this year tha for the firs have begun adopting policies to encourage young couples to have more children.
Of course, there is no question that the decline in population growth is very welcome news. Indee pocalypse that the Erhlichs foresaw as we put pocalypse that the Erhichs foresaw as we put ever And polling in the U.S. generally finds that most people would like to see a lower population
But for the last three centuries our civilization has been based on steady population growth and astronomical population growth since the midand Medicare will not work in a world where the population is flat or declining, at least, not withou ome substantial modification
Because lower fertility rates are correlated with educational attainment, the most uneducated, poorest parts of the world will be growing the fastest. The only places in the world currently with fertility rate well above the replacement rate are my will result in greater wealth disparity and my will res.
The new population paradigm will cause many headaches which our children and grandchildren
will have to wrestle. Some are obvious and some probably unforeseeable. It would be great if the world could start thinking through those issues now and begin to prepare. However, human behavior ver the centuries has shown that kind of long-term planning is not one of our strong suits.

Brown pelicans, roseate spoonbills, black skimmers and reddish egrets are among the birds nesting indense colonies, called rookerdense colonies, called rookeries. TPWD encourages folks to
watch out for these nesting birds so they are not disturbed during a sensitive time.
"With too many disturbances, an entire colony of thou-
sands of birds may abandon an ands of birds may abandon an
island and give up on breeding for the year, which can potentially lead to drastic population declines," said Trey Barron, a diversity biologist with TPWD. When approached too closely nearby, birds are frightened off their nests, leaving eggs and chicks exposed to the summer sun, which can cause them to overheat. The effluent will be discharged to Sheffied dith, thence to Houston Ship Channel/Buffalo Bayou Tida in Segment No. 1007 of the San Jacinto River Basin. The unclassified receiving water use is minimal aquatic life use for Sheffied ditch. The designated uses for Segment No. 1007 are navigation and industrial water supply.

In accordance with Title 30 Texas Administrative Code Section 307.5 and TCEQ's Procedures to Implement the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards (June 2010), an antidegradation review of the receiving waters was performed. A Tier 1 antidegradation review has preliminarily determined that existing water quality uses will not be impaired by this permit action.

Numerical and narrative criteria to protect existing uses will be maintained. A Tier 2 review is not required because no intermediate, high or exceptional aquatic-life-use water bodies have been identified in the discharge route. Existing uses will be maintained and protected. The preliminary determination can be reexamined and may be modified if new information is received.
The TCEQ executive director reviewed this action for consistency with the Texas Coastal Management Program (CMP) goals and policies in accordance with the regulations of the General Land Office and has determined that the action is consistent with the applicable CMP goals and policies.
The TCEQ executive director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The executive director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. The permit application, executive director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at Galena Park Library, 1500 Keene Street, Galena Park, Texas.

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a pubic meeting about this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit written or oral comment or to ask questions about the application.

Generally, the TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the executive director determines that there is significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. Atter the deadline for public comments, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all elevant and material, or significant public comments. The response to comments, along ith the executive director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyon who submitted public comments or who requested to be on a mailing list for this pplication. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions fo ecision. A contested ced case hearing or reconsids imilar to a civil trial in a state district ecision. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period; and the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request or contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request nust designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the executive director will orward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION. The executive director may issue final approval of the application unless a timely contested case hearing request or a timely request for reconsideration is filed. If a timely hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed, the executive director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and requests to th TCEO Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting
